Sub: Ratio of delivery of CMR to FCI and RRCs during KMS 2015-16 (Kharif) on OSCSC account.

- Ref: 1. Letter No.23199 dated 07-12-2015 of FS&CW Department on FCI delivery for 24 districts.
2. Letter No.1398 dated 20-1-2016 of OSCSC Ltd. for raw rice delivery to FCI/ RRC.

Madam/Sir,

I am to invite your attention to above referred letters which laid down that the ratio of delivery of CMR by millers to FCI in 1st phase districts shall be 100% during December and January, 2015 and 80% during February and March, 2016.

2. Similarly, for 2nd phase districts, CMR delivery to FCI depots was prescribed as 100% for January and February, 2016 and 80% for March and April, 2016.

3. However there has been a stalemate in delivery of CMR to FCI over gunny weight issue over the last couple of weeks. Further, there are some districts which are unable to meet the demands of TPDS from their own stocks and have to depend on transfer of CMR from other surplus districts.

4. Furthermore, there are some districts which consume only raw rice and need more CMR in their RRCs.

After careful consideration of the above facts, the following ratio is prescribed which would govern delivery of CMR to FCI by custom millers until they achieve the district delivery target for FCI which is likely to be communicated in March'2016:

5. Considering the present CMR delivery position due to stalemate caused on account of low gunny weight the above norm for FCI delivery may be relaxed till the end of February, 2016 by orders of Collectors on temporary basis. The individual miller would compensate the CMR less delivered to FCI, if he/ she has availed this relaxation latest by 31-3-2016.

6. District-specific ratio of delivery of CMR would be communicated shortly factoring in the balance requirement under NFSA and OWS as soon as the procurement status of Kharif is near final by March'2016.

7. This may be brought to the notice of all concerned.
