**Proceedings of the weekly paddy procurement review meeting
Held on 11.03.2014 at 3.30 PM in the Conference Hall of
F.S & C.W. Department**

The weekly paddy procurement review meeting was held under the Chairmanship of Commissioner-cum-Secretary, F.S & C.W. Department on 11th March, 2014 at 3.30 P.M. in the Conference Hall of F.S & C.W. Department. The following members were present in the meeting.

1) Review on Procurement of paddy and delivery of rice for KMS 2012-13

The delivery of CMR for the KMS 2012-13 made by different Procuring Agencies was reviewed. The following Agencies have delivered CMR as given below: - (Figure in MT)

During last week, 34000 MT of CMR has been received by OSCSC. As on date about 1.48 lakh MT rice of last KMS remains to be received. OSCSC's backlog is 1.41 lakh MT. On a close analysis, the following 5 districts are having more than 10% due. CMR due even though over all back log is about 4%.

1. Jagatsinghpur - 21%
2. Khurda - 12%

3. Deogarh - 12%
4. Nayagarh - 11%
5. Baleswar - 10%

The MD to monitor the delivery of this backlog on daily basis so that recovery is done. Sr. Officers may also be sent to maximum backlog districts to ensure 100% delivery by the defaulting millers. The GM Procurement has furnished the list of the mills of 10 districts who have pending dues of more than 2000Qtl. Of rice. Defaulters list of other 20 districts is to be prepared and placed in coming review meeting from highest defaulter to lowest defaulter. All Collectors may be asked to do physical verification of paddy/rice in all mills which have balance due of more than 1000Qtl. CMR. This verification may be done by team of Magistrate and C.S. staff in descending order of dues. As to put up Letter during this week.

2. Review on Procurement of paddy and delivery of rice for KMS 2013-14

The review of procurement of paddy and delivery of rice by different Agencies for the KMS 2013-14 was made. On review, it was found that as on 10.03.2014, 2834326MT of paddy has been procured.

The following table shows the Agency wise procurement of paddy and delivery of rice as on 10.03.2013.

Delivery in last week was only 6000 MT & 24000 MT of CMR has been delivered to RRCs & FCI depots respectively. The procurement by State Agencies other than OSCSC is very poor. Out of 28.34 L MT paddy procured, OSCSC has procured 27.2 Lakh MT which is around 96% of the total procurement. All Agencies

were asked to speed up procurement failing which they would not be considered as state Agencies in next KMS

3. Plan for delivery to FCI & Evacuation by FCI.

231157 MT of CMR has been received by FCI in the current KMS till 10.03.2014. The G.M, FCI informed that utilisation of Storage space is only 53.5% due to evacuation of rice. Stock position in FCI is as under.

Wheat	1.41 lakh MT
Rice	1.70 lakh MT

The GM, FCI informed that in March'14, FCI will evacuate 1, 00,000 MT of rice and induct 70,000 MT of wheat into the State. 43810 MT of rice has been evacuated as on 07.03.2014.

GM (Procurement) informed that 10000MT capacity at Sambalpur under CWC has been taken over on 07 Feb'14.

6. Arrangement to receive balance CMR of 2012-13

a) A letter has been sent to relax the delivery of CMR for 2013-14 to RRC (25%) for those millers who have completed delivery for KMS 2012-13. However, the millers who are delivering backlog CMR of KMS 2012-13 to RRCs (up to 31-03-14) are also to deliver CMR to FCI depots for paddy procurement in KMS 2013-14. By this process, they can process some paddy of KMS 2013-14 while completing the backlog of KMS 2012-13. A second letter to this effect which was to be issued to all Collectors & CSOs need to be issued during this week.

b) OSCSC has worked out a program for cross district transfer of CMR, from surplus to deficit districts so as to manage PDS up to March'14. The program has to be adhered to by districts for ensuring receipt of backlog CMR of 2012-13 KMS.

GM FCI suggested to GM OSCSC to create a separate current Bank account for receipts from FCI so as to track fund flow. GM OSCSC assured to look into the matter & take necessary action.


8. Demands of Millers Association:

The demands of Millers Association was also discussed in the weekly review meeting and following discussion were made.

1. No Custom Miller shall be allowed to Participate in other districts where such miller has not completed delivery of 100% CMR in his home districts. This proposal would be included in the Food & Procurement Policy.

2. The Custom Millers who have completed delivery of district specific quota to FCI during KMS 2013-14 will be allowed to deliver balance CMR to RRC. It was decided to issue a letter to all districts in this connection.
3. Rates of different items to be allowed to Custom Miller for KMS 2013-14 is to be prepared & placed by the DGM(F) ,OSCSC Ltd. in coming review meeting
4. Deducting actual rebate as per acceptance note without withholding a fixed percentage. MD was requested to give his opinion in this matter.
5. Non- acceptance of documents in some districts from custom millers in respect of CMR delivered to FCI for KMS 2013-14 was discussed. The OSCSC not receiving documents from millers. GM FCI informed that the millers are allowed to submit one bill for CMR delivered to FCI irrespective of number of lots.
6. Mentioning of actual weight of gunny consignment on the consignment Note as per weighbridge. The MD. OSCSC will ensure this.
7. Exemption of RMC fees & VAT/CST like other states was discussed in order to make the Levy Scheme viable. In this respect proposal has been submitted to Finance Department.
8. Creation of sufficient space by FCI at Ranital, Chandbali, Sakhigopal etc depot was discussed and GM FCI was requested to sort out the problem.
9. Reimbursement of Vat @5% on sale price of levy rice instead of @5% on MSP of paddy was discussed. This has already been communicated to all Collectors for information and necessary action.
10. Reimbursement and Finalisation of transport charges by FCI on Levy rice was discussed. The FCI will take suitable step in this matter.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair & all participants.
