Ratio of delivery of CMR to FCI and RRCs during KMS 2015-16 on OSCSC Account.

FS&CW Department Letter No.3967 dated 19.02.2016

Madam/Sir,

I am directed to invite your kind attention to the letter cited above which laid down, as an interim measure, in respect of Kharif procurement, the ratio of delivery of Custom Milled Rice (CMR) by Custom Millers to the Food Corporation of India (FCI) and Rice Receiving Centres(RRCs) of the Odisha State Civil Supplies Corporation (OSCSC).

- 2. It was also communicated in the said letter that district-specific ratio of delivery of CMR would be intimated shortly keeping in view the requirement under NFSA and Other Welfare Schemes (OWS) as soon as the procurement status of Kharif is near final by March'2016.
- 3. OSCSC, the biggest procuring agency of the State, procures paddy (and the resultant CMR) much more than what is required for the Public Distribution System under NFSA and OWS. Under the Decentralized Procurement System, surplus CMR is evacuated by FCI to meet the food grains need of deficit States. This evacuation is absolutely essential as neither the State needs the surplus grains nor has it the storage capacity to keep the huge surplus.
- 4. Within the State itself, some districts are surplus while some are deficit in terms of the procurement they have made and food grains they require in order to meet their PDS needs.
- 5. There are few raw rice consuming districts in our State with special needs for such rice.

- 6. There is also the need to expose Custom Millers to stringent quality control norms of FCI by making them deliver a certain percentage of CMR to the said Corporation.
- 7. Keeping the above in view vis-a-vis the overall picture of procurement that has emerged from the districts and the likely procurement to be made in upcoming Rabi, the ratio of delivery to FCI and RRCs is laid down below for the entire KMS 2015-16. This ratio shall also apply to delivery of CMR out of Rabi paddy in Rabi procuring districts and no separate ratio would be laid down.

- 8. The ratio of delivery fixed for a district shall apply to all Custom Millers in the district. The Custom Millers who have failed to deliver their quota to FCI during KMS 2014-15 shall have to deliver the backlog to FCI during the current KMS along with the quota for KMS 2015-16
- 9. However, the ratio of delivery mentioned in above referred letter will continue till the District FCI delivery target is achieved by individual miller. DC's may be issued accordingly by CSOs.

You are therefore requested to enforce the ratio of delivery by all Custom Millers appointed by you during KMS 2015-16 and see that your district delivers the quota fixed for FCI on a priority basis.
