Sub: Rates of Incidentals for KMS 2016-17.

Ref: Your letter No.6248 dt.26.10.2017.

Sir,

Inviting a reference on the subject stated above, I am to clarify the points raised in your letter No.6248 dt.26.10.2017 regarding rates of incidentals on Procurement for KMS 2016-17 for payment to custom millers –

1. Transportation Charges on Paddy was Rs.15.00 p.q. for 1st 10 Kms in KMS 2014-15 & was revised to Rs.18.00 p.q. The millers who have delivered entire CMR of KMS 2016-17 by 30.09.2017, shall only be entitled to get transportation charges at revised rate i.e. Rs.18/- p.q. for 1st 10 Kms.
2. Similarly, Custody & Maintenance Charges was revised. Minimum 3 months custody & maintenance charges are allowed irrespective of actual storage period of paddy instead of 2 months allowed in KMS 2014-15. This revision is applicable to millers who completed delivery by 30.09.2017. While calculating Average Storage Period for the millers **whose delivery of CMR completed after 30.09.2017**, the Stock Flow Statement shall be prepared upto 30.09.2017 for arriving at average storage period and not till completion of delivery. However, custody & maintenance charges shall be paid for the entire quality of CMR delivered at the rates arrived at on the basis of Average Storage period.
3. Gunny Depreciation: As per guidelines issued earlier on release of gunny depreciation, districts are to ensure followings –
 - a) The custom millers are to furnish accounts of old/ once used gunny bags to the district office indicating source of purchase etc.

- b) The district office shall keep accounts of old gunny bags, compiled from the accounts of individual millers.
- c) Certificate from Authorised Officer should be obtained to the effect that millers have not utilized the gunny bags of the farmers.

The objective behind issue of such guidelines on gunny depreciation is to comply the requirements of GoI and more importantly to ensure that the gunny bags of the farmers are not utilized by the millers for packing & transportation of paddy to mill point. Govt. in FS & CW Deptt., expressing concern on this matter has issued instructions vide letter No.4108 dt.20.02.2016 (addressed to Collectors with Memo to CSOs) to ensure that farmers bags are returned to them or they are suitably compensated for the cost of gunny bags. The letter No.7804 dt.18.04.2015 issued on this matter jointly signed by Principal Secretary, Cooperative Department and Commissioner-cum-Secretary, FS & CW Department, please be referred to.

As such, while releasing gunny depreciation district authority should see that proper accounts of old/ once jute gunny bags are submitted by the millers and that farmers bags have been returned or where utilized by miller, cost of gunny bags are paid to the farmers concerned.
