Minutes of the Video Conference held on 24.8.2018 at 3 PM in the OSWAN Hall of OCAC.

The meeting was chaired by Shri V.V. Yadav, IAS, Commissioner-cum-Secretary to Govt. in FS&CW Department.

The progress of delivery of CMR for the current KMS was discussed in the Video Conference wherein all CSOs and other related officials were present at their respective district Hqrs.

At the outset Shri Saroj Samal, MD, OSCSC gave the status of CMR delivery and the following picture emerged :

- > 7 districts have completed delivery of CMR. They are Angul, Dhenkanal, Jagatsinghpur, Jajpur, Kandhamal, Kendrapara and Mayurbhanj.
- ➤ OSCSC had directed 8 districts(Bhadrak, Deogarh, Gajapati, Jharsuguda, Keonjhar, Khordha, Koraput and Nuapada) to deliver CMR by 20.8.2018 vide their letter No. 388/MD dated 14.8.2018. None of these districts could complete delivery though space was available with them to accommodate balance CMR.
- OSCSC has directed 5 districts (Bolangir, Sambalpur, Kalahandi, Boudh and Cuttack) to deliver balance CMR by 31.8.2018 vide their letter No.385/MD dated 14.8.2018 and letter No.13579 dated 20.8.2018.
- MD, OSCSC submitted for fixing a revised deadline for remaining 10 districts including Kalahandi and Sambalpur.

Commissioner-cum-Secretary emphasized quick delivery of CMR by the custom millers, saying that not only it safeguards the quality of rice but also leads to savings for the Supplies Corporation.

After detailed deliberations the following decisions were taken:-

- In respect of 8 districts(Bhadrak, Deogarh, Gajapati, Jharsuguda, Keonjhar, Khordha, Koraput and Nuapada) with deadline of 20.8.2018, OSCSC shall prepare list of defaulters and make an analysis whether value of balance CMR to be delivered comes within security amount deposited by millers.
- The balance rice shall be recovered early.

- The defaulters shall not be allowed to participate in next procurement season except on 100% security.
- As Kalahandi and Sambalpur has some problem, this deadline of 31.8.2018 is waived out for them.
- Bolangir has submitted that it would not be able to deliver by 31.8.2018. Bolangir's case for extension of delivery date also needs consideration.
- OSCSC shall prepare list of defaulters in districts of Boudh and cuttack after the deadline of 31.8.2018 is over and prepare a statement of value of rice to be recovered and security deposited by millers.
- 7 districts have completed CMR delivery.
- 3 pending districts(Puri, Ganjam and Balasore) are to complete delivery within 15.9.2018.
- 10 districts(i.e. Kalahandi, Bolangir, Sambalpur, Nayagarh, Sundergarh, Subarnapur, Bargarh, Rayagada, Nawarangpur and Malkangiri) have space constraints. OSCSC shall fix the deadline and communicate immediately under intimation to FS & CW Department suitable deadlines for aforesaid 10 districts considering availability of space and other relevant factors. But, under no circumstances, this should extend beyond 30.9.2018. Defaulters shall not be allowed to participate in procurement operations under relaxed security norms.
- In order to create space in godowns, CSOs should start issuing CMR from 1.9.2018 against allotment month of October and November.
- CSOs were instructed to inform the retailers to prepare Bank drafts in advance basing on previous bimonthly allocation and deposit the same with RRC In-charge by 31.8.2018.
- CSOs of rice surplus districts like Bargarh, Subarnapur, Sambalpur, Malkangiri, Kalahandi, Nayagarh etc. were asked to monitor outward movement of CMR by State level contractors on regular basis.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
