Against the total CMR due of 29.03 lakh MT, FCI has received 7.40 Lakh MT of CMR and OSCSC has received 2152998 MT making a total receipt of 2893055 MT. This leaves a balance of about 12871 MT of rice to be received from the Millers of several districts.

Odisha State Civil Supplies Corporation has to monitor the backlog miller wise from now on so as to focus on defaulting millers and take appropriate action. GM, OSCSC informed that the defaulting Custom Millers are mainly from Kalahandi, Sonepur, Bhadrak & Balasore district against whom action would be taken for recovery of the CMR. The list of these millers may be submitted by next meeting for regular follow up.

2. Review on Procurement of paddy and delivery of rice for KMS 2012-13

The review of procurement of paddy and delivery of rice by different Agencies for the KMS 2012-13 was made. On review it was found that as on 09.04.2013, 4216960 MT of paddy has been procured.

The following table shows the Agency wise procurement of paddy and delivery of rice as on 08.04.2013.

It is seen that paddy procured this year (till on date) is 41% more than that of last KMS where as the CMR delivery is 12% higher than last year. This speaks that we need to speed up rice delivery so that surplus procurement can be evacuated to outside the state on a regular basis by FCI.

3. Plan for delivery to FCI

During review it was found that 326302 MT of CMR has already been received by FCI till date. The DGM FCI informed that utilisation of Storage space has increased to 85%. It is found that districts like Boudh, Deogarh, Dhenkanal, Angul and Sundergarh have not yet started delivery of CMR on OSCSC account to FCI till date. M.D. may follow up with these districts so that they start delivering to FCI immediately.

As the wheat allocations to the State has reduced, it was decided to move FCI Hq requesting not to induct wheat for four months so that CMR.can be received in the limited space available with FCI.

4. Programme for delivery of rice for April, 2013

The following programme has been made for delivery of rice at FCI depots for the month of April 2013. The Collector/CSO of the districts will ensure delivery of rice in respective FCI depot as per the programme.

Thus a total of 141400 MT will be delivered by the Agencies in FCI depots in April, 2013. The M.D., OSCSC Ltd will take follow up action to ensure delivery of CMR as per the above programme. He may monitor the progress of delivery on weekly basis so that the above monthly target is met. At present OSCSC has a pending DC of 79800 MT for FCI depots.

5. Evacuation by FCI

DGM informed that FCI will evacuate 73000 MT of CMR in April, 2013 & induct 40000 MT of wheat during April. At present 2.32 lakh MT of wheat is available in FCI godown & if 40,000 MT of additional quantity is received the total quantity will be 2.72 lakh MT which will meet the PDS requirement for 8 months.

6. Payment of dues by FCI

M.D., OSCSC informed that dues to the extent of Rs.302 crore for the year 2011-12 and Rs.120 crore for the year 2012-13 is pending with the FCI for payment. Similarly an amount of Rs.23.60 crore & Rs.12.98 crore is pending for payment to MARKFED & TDCC respectively. The D.G.M., FCI was impressed upon to look into the matter personally and expedite payment of outstanding dues of OSCSC Ltd. and MARKFED expeditiously.

7. <u>Demands of Millers Association</u>

The following demands of Millers Association were discussed.

- a) Revision and communication of rates of Incidentals payable to Custom Millers on CMR operations for KMS 2012-13..MD OSCSC may finalise the same taking into the costing sheet issued by Government of India
- b) Release of with-held amount towards delivery of Oscsc CMR to FCI after finalising and deducting rebate, if any on the basis of Acceptance Note issued by FCI at the time of rice delivery. No further amount may be with-held during current KMS 2012-13.MD may look into this issue and sort out the matter.
- c) Waiver of requirement of additional certificate for loading of paddy at Mandi by custom miller during current KMS 2012-13 by issuing suitable clarification as was done in earlier KMS 2011-12.
- d) Method of verification of stock and immune from unfounded criminal cases in case of natural and minor discrepancy in paddy and rice stocks lying with millers for things beyond their control.
 - e) Supply of adequate gunny bags.MD may issue suitable instructions

8. <u>Miscellaneous:</u>

The DGM, FCI requested OSCSC Ltd to utilise 4200 MT (1500 MT of Keonjhar + 2700 MT of Barbil) of rice lying in FCI godown towards PDS lest the quality may deteriorate as it is old stock .M.D.OSCSC may do the needful.
