Against the total CMR due of 29.03 lakh MT, FCI has received 7.41 Lakh MT of CMR and OSCSC has received 2160727 MT making a total receipt of 2902360 MT. This leaves a balance of about 5512MT of rice to be received from the Millers by OSCSC in following districts.

4. Kalahandi 1817

The defaulting Custom Millers are mainly from Bhadrak, Sonepur, Cuttack & Kalahandi districts against whom action needs to be taken for recovery of the CMR. The Commissioner-cum-Secretary instructed the M.D., OSCSC Ltd. to make analysis of the defaulting Custom Millers district wise and Miller wise. The G.M., Procurement stated that FIR has been made against defaulting Millers of Kalahandi & Subarnapur districts. FIR has also been made against Parvati rice Mill in the district of Cuttack. As per decision taken in the SLPC meeting held on 19.07.2013 under chairmanship of the Chief Secretary, it has been decided to lodge FIR against all defaulting millers who are defaulters in delivery of CMR. M.D. OSCSC shall review all stay order cases regarding defaulting Millers & take steps for vacating the stay order so that dues from defaulting Millers can be realised. Certificate cases shall also be filed simultaneously within a period of one month. (Action M.D., OSCSC).

3. Review on Procurement of paddy and delivery of rice for KMS 2012-13

The review of procurement of paddy and delivery of rice by different Agencies for the KMS 2012-13 was made. On review, it was found that **5417029**MT of paddy has been procured as on 12.11.2013.

The following table shows the Agency wise procurement of paddy and delivery of rice as on 12.11.2013.

It is seen that paddy procured this year (till on date) is 26% more than that of last KMS and the CMR delivery is 25% higher than last KMS date on date. But CMR due to be delivered as on date is 8.40lakh MT which is about 22.9% of the total procurement. As this quantity is to be received by 31.12.2013 as per extension of time by GoI, the pace of rice delivery has to be increased especially to FCI since bulk of the CMR is to be evacuated outside the State.

Plan for delivery to FCI & Evacuation by FCI.

During review, it was found that 1064567 MT of CMR has been received by FCI till date in the current KMS. The D.G.M, FCI informed that utilisation of Storage

space is 70.6% which is mainly due to induction of wheat into the State during Sept./ Oct.'13. Stock position in FCI is as under;

The DGM, FCI informed that for Nov.'13, 'FCI will evacuate 40,000 MT of rice and induct 40000 MT of wheat into the State. GM informed that during Oct.'13, 66,714MT of rice has been evacuated.

In order to ensure proper quality of CMR the Q.C. staff of OSCSC may be deputed to OSWC/CWC depots managed by the OSCSC so that the said stock can be delivered to FCI for rake movement.

G.M. FCI also suggested that some of the private depots of Bargarh hired by OSCSC can be handed over to FCI as more rice needs to be evacuated from Bargarh.

5. Programme for delivery of rice to FCI for Nov., 2013.

The target for Nov."13 has been fixed as under for delivery to FCI.

G.M. (Procurement) informed that OSCSC has taken over CWC depot at Koksara(10,000MT), Jatani(15,000MT) & 5000 MT of OSWC depot at Karanjia for utilisation. The CWC depot at Baljitpada (10000 MT) and OSWC depot Deogarh

(5000 MT) has also been taken over in the meanwhile for utilisation. So 2.09 LMT of PEG scheme is being utilised by OSCSC as informed by the M.D. OSCSC Ltd.

7. Demands of Millers Association:

The following demands of Millers Association was also discussed in the weekly review meeting.

- i) Participation under levy scheme may be made optional for willing millers.
- ii) The delivery percentage of CMR to FCI may be considered at 20 to 25% for most of the districts while higher percentage may be considered for super surplus districts.
- iii) Due to continuous problem in finalization of accounts and non-payment and/ or payment of much lower TC on rice and paddy by FCI, gradually procuring of paddy by agencies are coming down. The FCI Headquarters may be requested for increasing TC in comparison with OSCSC Ltd.
- iv) Creation of storage space by FCI at Gunupur to facilitate acceptance of CMR from custom millers of Rayagada district.
- v) Disposal of 75% under free sale is very difficult under present higher taxation regime. 1% RMC fees and 2% central sale tax may be waived. It was decided that, each of the above demands shall be looked into and whenever necessary, action would be initiated.

8. Raw rice movement by OSCSC

Discussion was made regarding raw rice to be lifted from FCI in raw consuming districts. It was felt necessary to reassess the requirement of raw rice by Corporation after utilisation of some raw rice in relief, in view of cyclone & incessant rain disasters.

The General Manager (Procurement) & General Manager (PDS) apprised that nearly 1,00,130 MT raw rice can be available with the OSCSC in 06 raw consuming districts namely Gajapati, Ganjam, Koraput, Malkangiri, Nawarangpur, Rayagada, assuring. If all the raw rice is realised from the custom millers. These districts will have PDS requirement of 1,21,680 MT till Jan'14 except Ganjam, whose requirement is calculated upto Feb'14.

He also apprised that (16,885 MT) Raw rice is available in non-consuming districts in Jharsuguda (5,385 MT) & Sambalpur (11,500 MT).

So far 10,124 MT raw rice has been transported to Ganjam district from Nawarangpur (1,640 MT), Kalahandi (7,027 MT), Sambalpur (1,251 MT) & Balangir (206 MT), for relief operation.

It is reported by the CSO-cum-District Manager, Ganjam that there may be damage of nearly 9,000 MT rice lying with custom miller because of severe cyclone, rain & flood. The Power Supply in Ganjam district has also not yet been restored. This may affect milling of paddy and receipt of CMR to meet the PDS requirement of the district in coming months. Even though the district has to receive about 40,000 MT rice from the miller, they may not realise the entire quantity by the Feb'14.

Considering all these factors following decisions were taken:

- i) Raw consuming districts may receive entire raw rice at RRC for distribution under PDS instead of delivering assigned quantity to FCI.
- ii) In Gajapati district, the shortfall quantity of 7,900 MT upto Jan'14 may be met from FCI / nearby districts.
- iii) In Ganjam district, the Corporation may lift 8,000 MT from FCI upto Feb'14 as per the requirement depending upon the progress of delivery of CMR by the custom millers. Besides 4,000 MT raw rice may be transported from Sambalpur & 2,000 MT raw rice may be transported from Jharsuguda district.
- iv) In Koraput district, the shortfall quantity of 6,166 MT upto Jan'14 may be met on transportation from Sambalpur (3,000 MT) & Jharsuguda (1,400 MT) and 1,800 MT may be lifted from FCI. Corporation may explore the possibility of transportation of stock to Koraput district from Sambalpur district by rake.
- v) In Malkangiri district the shortfall quantity of 900 MT upto Jan'14 may be met from FCI.
- vi) In Nawarangpur district the shortfall quantity of 2000 MT upto Jan'14 may be met on transportation from Sambalpur (1,000 MT) & Jharsuguda (1,000 MT).
- vii) In Rayagada district, the shortfall quantity of 18,000 MT upto Jan'14 may be met on lifting from FCI & balance 4,500 MT may be met on transportation from Sambalpur (3,500 MT) & Jharsuguda (1,000 MT). Corporation may explore the possibility of transportation of stock to Rayagada district from Sambalpur district by rake.
- viii)There is no State Level Transport Contractor operating from Jharsuguda to Rayagada, Koraput & Ganjam districts. Corporation may avail the services of the state level transport contractor operating from Sambalpur district to these

- districts at the approve rate for Sambalpur district, since there is no selected contractor from Jharsuguda to these district.
- ix) The above arrangement may involve extra transportation charges. But this is required to meet the PDS requirement as well as to realise the raw rice from custom millers in the non-consuming districts. Besides the raw rice which is prone to deterioration of quality on long storage will be utilised early.

In view of above, OSCSC may require Raw Rice of 36,600 MT from FCI for Gajapati, Ganjam, Rayagada & Malkangiri districts upto Feb'14. FCI has to make arrangements to make available of Raw Rice accordingly.

The General Manager (Procurement) & General Manager (PDS) apprised that nearly 100130 MT raw rice can be available with the OSCSC in 06 raw consuming districts namely Gajapati, Ganjam, Koraput, Malkangiri, Nabarangpur, Rayagada, assuring if all the raw rice is realised from the custom millers. These districts will have PDS requirement of 121680 MT till Jan'14 except Ganjam, whose requirement is calculated upto Feb'14.
