# 3. Review on Procurement of paddy and delivery of rice for KMS 2013-14

The review of procurement of paddy and delivery of rice by different Agencies for the KMS 2013-14 was made. On review, it was found that as on 14.09.2014, 4200501 MT of paddy has been procured.

57,427 MT & 18,600 MT of CMR has been delivered to RRCs & FCI depots respectively during the last two weeks. The procurement by State Agencies other than OSCSC is very poor. Out of 42.00 LMT paddy procured, OSCSC has procured 40.33 Lakh MT which is 96% of the total procurement. MD OSCSC promised to move one rake from Kalahandi and another rake from Bolangir district during October 2014 to create space for millers to deliver CMR in these two districts. Commissioner instructed that the defaulting millers of KMS 2013-14 would be allowed to participate in KMS 2014-15 procurement operation only after delivery of 100% CMR due. A letter in this connection shall be issued to all Collectors from the Department. The GM (Proc.), OSCSC was instructed to make analysis of rice delivery in defaulting districts with a focus on 10 districts which have a back log of about 20,000 MT of rice.

# 4. Plan for delivery to FCI & Evacuation by FCI.

978269 MT of CMR has been received by FCI in the current KMS till 10.10.2014. GM FCI informed that utilisation of Storage space is 64.4%. Stock position of FCI as on date is as under.

Wheat	1.92 lakh MT
Rice	1.81 lakh MT
Total	3.74 lakh MT

It was ascertained from G.M., FCI that in Oct., 2014, FCI will evacuate 1,10,000 MT of rice and induct 20,000 MT of wheat into the State.

The progress of PEG godowns at the following places was discussed.

Aska: - The Representative of RM, CWC stated that the PEG godown at Aska was completed in all respect. It was decided that a Joint Team will visit Aska for inspection of godown shortly.

<u>Nayagarh</u>: - The GM, OSWC stated that the approach road and electrification work of PEG godown at Nayagarh are not complete. He also stated that this work will be completed very soon. It was decided that a Joint Team will visit Nayagarh for inspection of godown on 20.10.2014.

<u>Dhenkanal</u>: - The GM, OSWC stated that the construction of PEG godown at Dhenkanal was at lintel level & truss level. It will be completed by March'2015.

Kendrapara:-Collector, Kendrapara needs to hear the objection of villagers in connection with the site of godown as per direction of the High Court. This is pending for more than one year now. A DO letter to be written to Collector to speed up from FS & CW Department.

<u>Angul</u>: - The GM, OSWC stated that the soil testing of PEG godown site at Anugul at Handapa was completed. The Estimate was under preparation.

<u>Puri</u>: - It was decided to issue a letter to Collector, Puri for allotment of an alternative land at an by 31.10.2014 failing which matter would be closed and GOI would be intimated of same. An ultimatum in this regard needs to be issued.

Anandpur: - CWC has gone for Retender for the third time.

<u>Kutra & Ujalpur</u>: - The land alienation process in favour of OSWC is yet to be completed. The matter is pending at Collector Sundargarh level, as informed by GM, OSWC. In any case, the estimate preparation can be started by CWC so that it can go to tender as soon as the land is handed over the OSWC.

The pending bills with FCI has gone up by nearly 90crores in last two weeks. GM FCI may look into this.

OSCSC was requested to submit all their bills relating to current KMS (2013-14) for CMR delivered up to  $30^{\rm th}$  Sept. 2014 positively by 31/10/14 and continue the same

trend month after month. A timeline needs to be fixed by OSCSC Head office for submission of bills after delivery at FCI for the District Manager-cum-CSOs.

### 8. <u>Miscellaneous:</u>

The M.D., OSCSC was requested to issue specific instruction to CSOs of Khurda, Nuapada, Sambalpur & Bolangir district to utilise the stock of 2012-13 by October, 2014 positively. Similarly, movement of CMR of 2012-13 of Bargarh and Kalahandi districts are to be made on priority as they have more than 0.16 lakh MT of CMR of 2012-13 KMS. The Commissioner instructed that the CMR of KMS 2012-13 should be liquidated within 31th Oct. '2014. During the month of September, only one rack movement of CMR (i.e. from Kalahandi district) was done. GM (Proc.) stated that the two backlog rack movement will be done during month of October.

Representative of millers raised the need for a railway siding at Junagarh. Commissioner said that there was a genuine need for such a facility at Junagarh where we can lift 6 to 7 rakes in a month. The matter is to be taken up with ECo Railways.

GM FCI said that the railway siding at Hirakud has few facilities in spite of good business.

It was decided that correspondence would be made with Railways in this regard.

### 9. Demands of Millers Association:

- 1. Representative of millers said that they have requested GoI for allowing proportionate relaxation on account of damage, discolour in uniform specification of rice against additional relaxation of 1% granted for above refraction in the uniform specification of paddy for KMS 2014-15. We may await GoI's response...
- 2. As regards want of sufficient space in RRCs in Angul, Sonepur, Kalahandi etc. OSCSC would take correctional steps to receive CMR.
- 3. As regards reimbursement of 2% RMC fees, FS & CW Deptt. would prepare the procedure of reimbursement on the basis of documentation of export of rice to outside states.
- 4. Commissioner appreciated the stand of AORMA that allotment of target and delivery of paddy should be made to mills strictly on the basis of earlier performance rather than installed capacity.
- 5. OSCSC would look into AORMA's request for observance of 'Pending claim settlement week' and finalise a date for same.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair & all participants.
